**Nominating Committee Submits
List of Four Candidates**

Carol Nau, Debbie Hendricks and LaRita Lang were appointed to serve on the Nominating Committee for your Credit Union. Together, they have submitted the names of four candidates for your consideration of the four positions on the Board of Directors.

These candidates have provided their qualifications and reasons they desire to serve your Credit Union. Biographical information about this year's candidates is included in this special insert. Please take a moment to review this information. Feel free to contact your Credit Union if you have questions.

Voting Procedures are as follows:

Credit Union bylaws state that election for the Board of Directors will be conducted by ballot, except when there is only one nomination for each position. The election will not be conducted by ballot and there will be no nominations from the floor when there is only one nominee for each position to be filled.

Additional nominations for vacancies of the Board of Directors may also be made by petition signed by one percent of the Credit Union members. Nominees by petition must also submit a statement of qualifications and biographical data with their petition, along with a signed certificate that they are agreeable to the nomination and will serve if elected to office. The closing date for receiving nominations by petition is February 7, 2012.

If an election is required, voting will take place at your Credit Union office lobbies at 1630 Q Street and 301 North 52nd Street during normal office hours April 12, 2012 through

April 17, 2012. Voting will also be available 5:30 pm to 6:30 pm at the Annual Meeting. Members must be at least 16 years of age and must have joined the Credit Union by April 10, 2012 to be eligible to vote

If you would like to vote but are unable to come to the Credit Union or the Annual Meeting, you can get an absentee ballot by submitting a written request to the Credit Union, which must be received no later than March 15, 2012, by the end of the business day. Absentee ballots will be mailed on March 16, 2012 and must be returned to the Credit Union by midnight April 13, 2012.
